

LOOKING OUT FOR?

DAN, HOW HAS PREPARATION BEEN THIS WEEK AFTER A GREAT START TO THE SEASON?

So they'll present a different challenge I'm sure, plenty of kicking, not kicking the ball away but actual kicking to attack. They'll defend a little differently as well but yeah, a different challenge we're excited about.

ADAM, BRUMBIES HAVE GOT OFF TO A GREAT START IN SUPER RUGBY, HOW IMPORTANT IS IT FOR YOUR SIDE TO EMULATE THAT?

It's so important, especially with us only having two cracks at home every win counts and job number one for us is getting into that top three. We were proud of our finish last year, but this season we're putting that higher expectation on ourselves and we hope to go at least one further and make that Grand-Final.



SPOTLIGHT: POWELL V SMITH


The battle of the halfbacks could be crucial tonight, as two of the competitions best in Joe Powell and Aaron Smith face off.

Following months of preparation, long nights after hard days at work, tonight the Brumbies get their Super W campaign underway against Rugby WA.

The mission this season is clear, go one better and make the Grand-final. It's been the only message coming out of Super W camp this season, players and staff not shying away from challenging themselves for more.

In previous seasons the Brumbies have narrowly missed out on playing in the grand final, finishing in fourth place in 2018 and third place in 2019.

Although inspired by those past seasons, it will be a new group who takes to the field this evening, led by two exceptional young stars, both having been here since the start.

If Jane Garraway and Michaela Leonard don't represent success for the Brumbies, what could? In 2018, both were inexperienced but were thrust into starting roles straight away.

Now, in year three they will co-captain the Brumbies side. It's a remarkable story, and one which will hopefully inspire a generation of players coming through and in truth, it already has.

Leonard will pack down at lock alongside Emily Sogal, forming a dynamic looking second-row duo. Closer to the front of the scrum, Krystal Fyfe makes her Brumbies debut alongside Harriet Elleman and Lousie Burrows.

Emma Masi and the experienced Rebecca Smyth start in the backrow alongside the talented Zali Waihape-Andrews. Zali is one of a number of quality products coming through the ranks at the Brumbies, with youngsters Ella Ryan, Grace Kemp and Ainsley Scrivener. All three are finishing up their schooling this year and are dedicated to rugby.

Ryan would have almost certainly made her Super W debut last year if it weren't for her age. A star already at 17, Ryan excelled for UC in the Uni 7s and also earned national honours in the code in 2019.

Now Ryan turns her attention to 15's, partnering co-captain Jane Garraway in the halves, while out wide, speed-demons Darcy Read and Gabrielle Petersen on debut will look to play off centre pairing Sammie Wood and Pesi Palu.

Talei Wilson completes the run-on side, returning to the squad this season after missing out in 2019 due to injury.

Tania Afamasaga, Peta Cox and Iris Verebalavu are the front row replacements, while Grace Sullivan and Pearl Rakete complete the forwards replacements.

Phoebe Loughhead and Claudia Obst will provide firepower off the bench in the backs.



The rugby 7s event hosted by the Braidwood Redbacks and the ACT Brumbies was a dream come true, as 44 teams and thousands of supporters descended on the small-town last Saturday.

After the cancellation of the Braidwood Cup due to drought conditions, the community came up with the idea to host a rugby 7s competition and carnival, with no expectation of the support they would receive.

The manager of the Braidwood Redbacks Nick Pengelly said that after they opened the registration for the event it took off and never slowed down.

The competition received so much interest and support from different teams that organisers had to close registration way before the event, as they had reached max capacity of teams and were still receiving registrations.

"Suddenly there's all these teams over New South Wales and from Sydney, from Canberra, Illawarra. We've got 44 teams here." Pengelly said.

Not only did the town receive support from local and interstate teams, but from thousands of people from Canberra and surrounding towns.

"Heaps of Canberra people have come down to shop and help support the locals. In this rugby here today, what a turn out. I've never seen so many people at the rec ground. I've come and watched them play rugby, the redbacks, on a Saturday sometimes and you might have 50 to 100 people but there's thousands of people here today." said a local from Braidwood.

The people of Braidwood hope that this event revitalises the town after the horrors they have faced from the recent bushfires.

The Brumbies saw some familiar faces out on the field during the competition, as former Brumbies Ben Alexander, Andrew Smith and many more all laced up their boots to do their part.

As well as the amazing turn out of supporters, Braidwood received some much-needed rain that only added to the magic of the day.

Brumbies prop Scott Sio knew just how much the rain meant to the people of Braidwood and to the country overall. "It's good to see a lot of rain. I know a lot of people have been praying for rain and it's what the country needs at the moment so. It's kind of fitting that it's raining as well today during the sevens." Sio said.

The Brumbies were nothing but excited about the day, with Sio saying that it's amazing to see all the different communities coming together to get behind the event.

As the curtains closed on the competition and after many rounds of rugby had been played it would be West Harbour who took the win over Queanbeyan 12-5 in the men's final and Jindabyne who defeated the Wests in the women's final 17-7.

Soon after the final whistles many headed off for a nice cold drink and went to watch the yabbie race to cap off the day the right way.

Both the Brumbies and the Redbacks hope that the success of this 7s event will help put Braidwood back on the right track, for the town and the people within it.






