

HOW DID YOU ASSESS LAST FRIDAY'S WIN, WERE YOU HAPPY?

Happy with the outcome, happy with parts of the game. Obviously start of the game we were excellent, put them under a lot of pressure in defence which turned into points, but we probably lost our way there for a little bit. Happy we managed to get ourselves out of that, and really grind out a tough win at home against a good side.

Those momentum swings are going to happen within games. There will be times when we're the dominant side, there'll be times when things go against us, a couple of mistakes or a couple penalties in a row but it's about how you deal with those times and executing a plan to regain that dominance is what decides games.

I was impressed by how our guys dealt with it. Some of the more experienced players, obviously they've been through it but the younger guys, they were never daunted by the occasion at any point. It was new to them, but they just got on with it and understood some adjustments needed to be made, and we made them. So yes overall, good aspects but we know we've got a lot of improving to do from that game.

BRUMBIES, REBELS IS BECOMING A REAL RIVALRY, IS THERE THAT BIT EXTRA BETWEEN THESE TWO SIDES NOW?

To a certain extent. Any game against Aussie conference sides has that something special, there's that added element where you can win points and deny them points. You have guys competing as well for Wallaby positions, that's probably more towards the back of the mind but it's there for sure.

Look, they're the last team to beat us here at GIO Stadium so yes, we're definitely motivated that's for sure but so are they.

CADEYRN NEVILLE COMES INTO THE SIDE THIS WEEK, NICK FROST TO THE BENCH, ARE YOU CONFIDENT IN BOTH THOSE GUYS?

With Cadeyrn, we're comfortable with him going in there for Darcy who should only be out this week. We're confident in him, we've worked with him very closely since he arrived to make sure we get his knowledge and detail on how we want to play up to speed quickly. His work behind the scenes with players and us coaches has been outstanding, he's really committed a lot of hours to as I said, getting up to speed so he'll do a good job. He knows what's expected at this level, and at this club as a tighthead lock; good set-piece, repeat efforts and physicality.

With Frosty, he's a great kid who's worked extremely hard who knows where he is in his career and doesn't get too ahead of himself, just gets on with the work. His commitment and improvement in the last six months or so has been exceptional. He's only starting his journey but we're confident he's ready to do a job for us tonight so I'm just excited for him, making your debut, it's an awesome time for him and his family.

For Irae Simone, the journey to the Brumbies took many different turns, and although it was difficult and it took time for the talented centre to find his fit, he's now right at home as part of the Brumbies family.

"MY FAMILY AND I ARE REALLY ENJOYING OUR TIME HERE IN CANBERRA AND THE ORGANISATION HAS WELCOMED US WITH OPEN ARMS SINCE I ARRIVED HERE LAST YEAR."



Simone began his journey in New Zealand where he was born. The Auckland native actually played some of his high school rugby against current teammate Solomone Kata, but like his wing counterpart, Rugby League is where Simone would get his start.

Signing with South Sydney in 2014, the Rabbitohs were the first to see Simone's potential. Breaking through the ranks at the then perennial NRL premiership contenders was always going to be tough, so Simone found refuge back in Rugby Union with Norths.

In 2016, Simone shot onto the Shute Shield scene, once again as a teammate of a current Brumby, Will Miller. With Miller as skipper and Simone the star, Norths grabbed Shute Shield glory that year, and Simone's rugby career was beginning to kick-off in a major way.



Later that year, Simone was crowned NRC player of the year after dominating with the Sydney Rays. Those performances earned Simone a contract with the Waratahs for the 2017 season, where he went on to make 10 appearances for the Sydneysiders.

Simone seemed on a crash-course with a starting jersey at the 'Tahs, but for whatever reason it just didn't happen. The 'Tahs loss turned Brumbies gain in 2019.

Simone made the move to Canberra last season and was an instant hit, showcasing his unique blend of power and finesse. He had his struggles, but by the time the Brumbies put together their magical late season run, Simone was at the heart of Peter Hewat's attack.

Now, having resigned with the club 'till at least the end of 2021, Simone can begin to look forward, hoping to make that 12 jersey his own. The other goal, potentially, a gold coloured jersey as well.

THE BIG PICTURE


SPOTLIGHT: KATAV KOROIBETE

These two former NRL stars are set to matchup in one of the most exciting head to head battles you will ever see. Both with the ability to break a game open at a moments' notice, you do not want to take your eyes off these two when the ball swings their way.

Koroibete came out of the Rugby World Cup as a bonified superstar. Someone who's reputation had been growing, it felt like the dazzling speedster went up a level on the World stage, ultimately being awarded the John Eales Medal for his efforts in gold.

The Rebels will be hoping he can recreate that form in Super Rugby while Kata is only starting to create his rep in rugby union. A strong showing on debut certainly helped Kata's cause, his bally carrying causing the Reds fits in the early stages last week.

In the end, it may be Kata's ability to contain Koroibete that will determine who wins this matchup. We know Kata will let loose will ball in hand, but if he can stick to task while defending the Rebels key threat, the Brumbies will be just that much closer to victory.


This exposure may also be good for the Redbacks, who are planning to expand and make some major changes to improve their club in future.

The Super W season kicks-off on the 15th of February against Rubgy WA, and this year the Brumbies will have two captains with Jane Garraway and Michaela Leonard sharing the role.

Coming off the back of their first hit out, in a trial match against the Melbourne Rebels, Garraway says that it was good for the squad to have the game time. "I think it was good to have a hit out so girls can really understand what we're trying to achieve and why we play certain plays.

"I definitely think it was a good learning point for us and we can move forward and build off that." It was also the first time thar her and Leonard had shared the role between them, with Garraway saying that they can bring the team together.

"Michaela leads by good example with discipline and hard hitting, whereas I've got a bit more communication, but I think we balance each other out and can help bring this team together." Leonard echoed Garraway's sentiment and went on to praise her counterpart lauding the value that the scrumhalf brings to the squad. "I think Jane brings a lot of that knowledge and that game smart, that's where she really adds her value.

"She's quick, she can make good decisions on the run and a good leader and good communicator

out there." It is especially significant for Leonard as being named co-captain is an absolute honour for her and caps off a remarkable two years, having made her Wallaroos debut in 2019 and captaining the A side against Fiji.

In the 2019 season, the Brumbies finished third and narrowly missed out on a spot in the grand final, after losing to the Reds in the semi-final. Leonard said that the squad wants to redeem themselves after their early exit. "That's the goal, taking it one step further and hopefully knocking Queensland and New South Wales out of those top two positions. "It's what we're working for and hopefully coming into round one, we'll be feeling even better and stronger as the season progresses."

With little over one week left until the start of the season, the squad has one more trial game left and they are going up against the defending champions, the NSW Waratahs. "The trial is going to be really exciting. Coming off the back of the game against the Rebels last weekend, I think it's a good opportunity to improve on the things we picked up last weekend and take it one step further and hopefully build our squad coming into round one on the 15th" Leornard said. "Pretty special, it's been a really big two years for me. From the first game in the inaugural season of Super W to where I am now, it's an absolute honour."




